

PASTOR'S NOTES:

Thanks to Mr. Thomas Jorgensen, we were able to establish a structure for promoting the concept of stewardship in our parish. Stewardship is a way of life, and it comes from recognizing that all good things in our lives (health, people, financial resources, etc.) come from God, and that we need to respond in gratitude, to give back something of what we have received (everything!) as an offering of ourselves. The Biblical norm is the "tithe," which is 10%, but making any committed and conscious kind of return is a good thing, provided that it is decided in a prayerful way. For example, part of our "tithe" is to give God back one of the seven days that He gives us each week—the Lord's Day is, indeed, His day, and we give Him the worship He is due, and then use the day as a day of family and rest (recognizing that some professions require work on that day, for the common good). In giving the day to God, we end up having things we do not have on other days-freedom to enjoy those we love, freedom to rest from our usual routines, freedom from work, freedom to worship. I hope that you will take the opportunity to visit our ministry fair in the gym this weekend, when we have a chance to "tithe" our time and talent to the work of the Church, the work of the People of God as they witness to the Lord in the world. Thanks to Patti Wynne and all the people of the stewardship committee for getting this project done. It is a chance for the people who are active in various "ministries" to "show off" (in a humble way, of course) and to solicit "new blood" in some of the things that our people are doing already. Each of us has a unique contribution to make which no other can do (see 1 Cor. 12), and the harmony of the many gifts makes a pleasing whole. Each has something to offer that the rest need, and each has an important contribution to make. The Body of Christ (with Christ Himself as the Head) is made up of many parts which are all vital to the good of the whole.

We are, of course, most delighted to welcome Fr. Timothy Danek to our parish as our new assistant. Father Danek is from the Cathedral parish in Lincoln, where he attended school (along with Pius X High School). I am, of course, delighted to have another priest here at Plattsmouth, and I look forward to Father being a part of many things here in our wonderful parish. I have been privileged to work with many good priests over the years in parish work in McCook, Lincoln, and Hastings during the last 31 years, and

it will be a joy to have a good young priest in our midst. Fr. David Azambawu was young also (in my book!), but he only overlapped with my assignment here for a few months before he returned to his native Ghana to become a pastor there. There are many things that I am anxious for Fr. Danek to become involved in here in our parish, and we are in the process of getting him acquainted with us. He is the middle of five siblings and he was taught at Pius X High School by (among others) Fr. Cyza of Nebraska City Lourdes, and he was a high school classmate of my last assistant in Hastings, Fr. Stephen Graeve. I understand that he is a very talented man with many gifts to offer us and I look forward with you to getting to know him. Welcome!

Comparing the last two fiscal years (those ending on June 30 in 2017 and 2018), we had an increase of offertory (envelope) income of about \$120,000, from \$605,730.96 to \$726,043.85, an increase of 20.0%. This is good news that is very welcome. The scary news (if any) is that we are being subsidized now by the diocese (through the Francis Fund of Joy of the Gospel) to the tune of \$160,000 per year, so just to cover the loss of the subsidy (in the next year or two, we do not know for sure), we are still short of even that much, let alone increases in costs of other expenses, such as utilities. Tuition in the school has risen (and, most likely, will continue to rise), and we are proud of the families that have tried to give more sacrificially (especially school families). The diocesan subsidy has given us breathing room to make some of these adjustments, and is currently helping us spend money on long-postponed but needed projects. After some good and necessary drainage work around the school, we found other issues (with the membrane) that need be resolved when the rest of the work is done—an added cost, but with "final" resolution of the perpetual school basement problem now in sight. We were not able to schedule the church roof and windows with the contractor this building season, and the design sketch for the sidewalks and landscaping is just now finished and being sent to bid. The doors and handicapped-accessible entry is in the process of being bid now. And the settling which was disrupting our windows on the west side of the Commons is now fixed. Slowly, but surely, we are making progress, thanks to all of you. God bless our good stewards!
