Prayer Chain Information

The prayer chain at Church of the Holy Spirit allows for prayers to be requested with anonymity, and then be prayed for by many people. During the 1970s, one person initiated and ran the Prayer Chain by herself. In about 2012, to simplify the process, the electronic prayer chain was established. The originator of the Prayer Chain still contacts a few of our noncomputer-using parishioners. There are over 185 "Prayer Warriors" (Prayer Chain recipients). We suggest that they say one decade of the Rosary for the requests listed.

To put in a prayer request: For emergency or urgent prayer requests, 24 hours a day, the best way is to text or call 402-943-9959. Standard prayer requests can also be called to 402-943-9959, or to 402-296-3441, or emailed to CHSPRAYERCHAIN@gmail.com. Thank you.

To be a Prayer Warrior for this, Contact Carol Tilson at CHSPRAYERCHAIN@gmail.com, or call or text 402-943-9959. (This is the same contact information for *requesting* prayers.)

Please know that Prayer Warrior contact information is never shared or used for any other purpose. Can anyone request prayers? YES!! There are a few guidelines on what we can list, and, of course, God knows what is in your heart, even if we need to limit what can be listed:

- 1. Anonymity. Basically, if you do not have the individuals consent, their name cannot be used. Initials or first names work great, or requests for "Special Intentions". A Special intention is also made when the body of the prayer is either too complex, too large, or too sensitive, or it could identify the person by their situation. If asked by someone wondering who the individual listed is, they are told we are not at liberty to disclose.
- 2. No Politics. Requests made for politicians, parties, or anything listed on a ballot is not permitted. You may request a simple "Special Intention".
- 3. No Advertising. The Prayer Chain is not used to promote outside events, people or businesses. Example Please buy my house at 110 Garden St. is not acceptable. Prayers to sell a home is acceptable. Or, you may request a simple "Special Intention".
- 4. Public Chain mail (as found on Facebook or other social media) is not appropriate.
- 5. The Prayer Chain coordinator may edit prayer requests if they fall under the above categories. Most of the time, we cut and paste what you send us via text or email.

Prayer Warriors are essential. Every prayer request we receive is also essential. No prayer request is too big or too small. We cannot thank you enough for your faith and prayers.

Magnifi Kid!

Magnifi Kid! ... is a monthly publication similar to Magnificat, but for children 6 to 12. CHS is able to get a bulk rate on this if we have a minimum of 10 subscriptions. Parents who would like to join our bulk group subscription – please email the parish office at plattsmouthHSC@cdolinc.net by Sept 28, to let us know.

Do not send in money yet – we need to find out if we will have 10 subscribers!

The annual subscription rate is \$15 (which is less than half the regular price). You will receive 12 months from January to December 2021 (52 issues). Subscribers receive the issues on a monthly basis, to be picked up outside the parish office, just as the regular Magnificats are distributed.

In each month's packet, children will find a booklet of sixteen color pages for each Sunday, and also special issues for the major feast days (Christmas, Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, Ascension, Assumption, All Saints Day). Every week, MagnifiKid offers: All the readings and the prayers of the Sunday Mass with explanations of the difficult words and the meaning of the rituals; a daily prayer adapted from the Liturgy of the Hours; many suggestions on how to live the entire week with the Lord; various games, a comic, and activities to help children learn about Christian life and culture; a page intended for the parents with suggestions for family prayers. This can help

- to accompany them on the path of daily prayer;
- to help them develop and nourish their spiritual lives;
- to hand on to them our rich Christian spiritual values;
- to encourage them to participate fully in the life of the Church.

Next week is the international date this year for the Peter's Pence collection, the traditional collection taken up every year to support the Holy Father and his particular projects and causes, delayed this year because of the pandemic. This collection has been around in some form for over one thousand years and is our way of showing our solidarity with the Vicar of Christ and our "catholic" unity in the universal Church. No one should ever doubt that "where Peter is, there is the Church." This last quote, by the way, is attributed to St. Ambrose in the fourth century. He was the Bishop of Milan and the man who brought St. Augustine into the Church. It means that Peter (the first Bishop of Rome) is the touchstone of doctrine and orthodoxy among God's holy people. He and his successors have always

been the visible sign of unity among us. Envelopes were sent to you with your packets earlier in the year (since the traditional date for the collection is toward the end of June, near the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29), but if you no longer have it and would still like to contribute, just mark an envelope accordingly and return it at the time of the regular collection next weekend. Next weekend from 2-3 on Sunday afternoon is the traditional annual Life Chain in Plattsmouth. We will be meeting around the intersection of Eighth Avenue and Chicago, with signs provided. meant to be a time of silent witness to and prayer for our fellow citizens. Come and join us, rain or shine, and pray for the conversion of hearts. The longer that I have been a part of this struggle, the more I realize that, as important as judicial, legal, and political issues are—and they should not be neglected—the most important tool pro-life people have is prayer. It cannot, in the long run, fail us. Despite almost fifty years of social struggle in our country, the pro-life message has not been shamed or intimidated into silence, despite the efforts of many cultural leaders. In fact, it is the voice of conscience in our culture. The well-marketed notion of "choice" which has been successfully propagated in our times hides the horror of lives of adult men and women, not to mention children, who have been harmed by the abortion industry (indirectly funded by, and, as some would wish to see, directly funded by, taxpayers). As one person once stated, there is no "choice" when a person feels compelled by fiancé, family, or friends to abort. This person compared it to feeling like a trapped animal that has no option but to gnaw off a paw in order to escape. Pray for those victimized, adults and children. Thanks be to God, there are alternatives. I want to commend to God and to your prayers the soul of one of my former parishioners when I was the pastor of Blessed Sacrament in Lincoln (1991-2000), Julie Schmit-Albin, who was one of those outstanding people that fought for those who were victimized. I have been privileged to know many outstanding women (especially) and men who pioneered Birthright and other pro-life initiatives, even before the Supreme Court created the abortion "right" in 1973. Witness to the truth, but always in charity!
