Holy Sepulchre Cemetery guidelines for Spring Cleanup of decorations

Prior to the start of spring cleanup, all decorations from winter must be removed from graves by <u>April 1st</u> except those in permanent vases. No shepherd hooks, statues, figurines, eternal light, etc. are allowed from April through November unless they are permanently and correctly installed in the minimal 4" foundation ribbon of the headstone. <u>Grave blankets are not allowed any time of the year</u>. Our parishioners who maintain the cemetery grounds will clear out the above stated objects that should not be in the cemetery April-November. Before April 1st, please check any cemetery areas where you have placed decorations to make sure they are kept within the guidelines. If in doubt, please remove any objects, or call the rectory for clarification. A note: Beginning in 2024, Spring Cleanup for the cemetery will be March 1st, to match Oak Hill's date.

Diocese of Lincoln Chrism Mass Monday, April 3rd at 5:00pm in Lincoln. Cathedral of the Risen Christ 3500 Sheridan Blvd, Lincoln, NE The Chrism Mass tradition dates back nearly 2000 years and remains one of the most solemn and important liturgies in the Church year. Bishop Conley will concelebrate the Mass with most of the Priests in the diocese and consecrate the sacred Chrism and bless the other oils. This is an opportunity to both witness the beautiful and moving service and to speak with some of our former parish priests following the Mass.

Some of our parishioners who are going to Lincoln for this will be leaving from the Church of the Holy Spirit parking lot at 3:15 pm on Monday, April 3rd.

Dear Parishioners,

Stewardship is an important process in every parish. Often times, the process gets identified ONLY as "that time when Father asks us for money!" And that is unfortunate, only because there is a lot more to Stewardship than just our financial giving, as important as that is. Stewardship is recognizing God's blessings in your life, and being intentional about your response to those blessings. My hope for Church of the Holy Spirit parish is that we can build a Stewardship Committee of parishioners who share the Catholic Church's vision of a stewardship spirituality, and share that vision with all parishioners. A stewardship spirituality can be explained simply as **identifying your gifts, being grateful to God for your gifts, cultivating and using them responsibly, share them with others, and to return them back to God with increase.**

Before we can arrive at the reality of a new Committee that will assist me in this important process, we first have to have a person (or persons) who will serve as our Stewardship Coordinator. I am grateful to Patti Wynne for her hard work and leadership as our previous stewardship coordinator. Patti stepped down last summer, and our parish now needs a well-organized person or couple to take this up again with new fervor. I am asking you for a volunteer parishioner or couple that would serve our parish as the Stewardship coordinator. If this is something that you could possibly see yourself assisting the parish with, I would ask you to take it to prayer, and then reach out to me to discuss it.

Since I am still fairly new to the parish, and there are many different possibilities going forward with stewardship, my expectation is that we start small and grow larger over time as we learn more together about the stewardship process. The stewardship renewal that occurs every fall season is the most important part of the process, and I think that is where our parish committee could begin its focus. There are a lot of resources one can find online and in books about stewardship, and even step by step guides on how to facilitate the process in the parish. In other words, CHS stewardship coordinators and volunteers would not be required to reinvent the wheel! We can see what has worked well in other parishes, and follow their example.

We just need to get started! We need a coordinator and a small band of helpers to get organized and make stewardship a <u>very normal and important thing for our parish</u>. Time, talent and treasure are all good and wonderful gifts from God, so reading about and hearing the word "stewardship" out loud should not cause us to wince. Hearing that word should always cause us to reflect and think about "How am I doing in response to the Lord's blessings I have received? How can I get better in my response?" If this is something Christ is moving you towards assisting with, please reach out to me.
