# 40 Hours Devotion at Church of the Holy Spirit with evening conferences by Bishop Finn.

February 25, 2024

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in Church, <u>March  $3^{rd}$ ,  $4^{th}$ , and  $5^{th}$  – Celebrating the national Eucharistic Revival</u>

Two evening conferences on Sunday and Monday @ 7:00 given by Bishop Robert Finn, Chaplain to the School Sisters of Christ the King in Lincoln. Confessions will be available both nights.

Begins with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in church after the 10:30 Mass on Sunday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Ends with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament after the 8:10 Mass Tuesday with Eucharistic Procession throughout the church.

Holy Sepulchre Cemetery guidelines for Spring Cleanup of decorations •Prior to the start of spring cleanup, all decorations from winter must be removed from graves by March 1<sup>st</sup> except those in permanent vases. No shepherd hooks, statues, figurines, eternal light, etc. are allowed from March through November unless they are permanently and correctly installed in the minimal 4" foundation ribbon of the headstone. Grave blankets are not allowed any time of the year. Our parishioners who maintain the cemetery grounds will clear out the above stated objects that should not be in the cemetery March-November. Before March 1<sup>st</sup>, please check any cemetery areas where you have placed decorations to make sure they are kept within the guidelines. If in doubt, please remove any objects, or call the rectory for clarification.

**Please mark your calendars for March 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>, as we host our 40 Hours Devotion.** In addition to moving our Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration to the church during this period, Bishop Robert Finn will be here to give an evening conference both Sunday and Monday evening at 7:00 p.m. He and I will also be available after his talks for the sacrament of confession, in both the St. Joseph Room and Adoration Chapel.

**What is the Eucharistic devotion we call 40 Hours?** It is a special exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for a continuous period over three days, totaling around 40 hours. We will begin with the 10:30 Sunday Mass on March 3<sup>rd</sup>, having Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on the altar immediately at the end of the Mass. (Therefore, our perpetual adoration ministry will move from the chapel to the church for the 40 Hours.) The Forty Hours devotion will end after the 8:10 Mass Tuesday morning, concluding with a Eucharistic procession around the inside of church, and following with Benediction. The Blessed Sacrament will then be moved back to the Adoration Chapel.

Even if you do not have a scheduled adoration hour from Sunday through Tuesday morning, you are encouraged to come to church during the 40 Hours to pray and receive these special graces, especially during the holy season of Lent. The number 40 and period of three days is a remembrance of the 40 hours from Jesus' burial until His resurrection, but also a remembrance of the 40 days fast of Jesus in the desert before His public ministry began.

Forty Hours is kind of like a parish renewal or mission, but with much more time for personal prayer, and fewer talks. Bishop Finn will be visiting both Sunday and Monday evening to give his meditations on faith and the Eucharist. I hope that you can join us both evenings at 7:00 p.m., as well as the opportunity to go to confession afterwards. 40 Hours devotion is a special time where our parish can come together to pray, both individually and as a community *liturgically*.

I say liturgically, because adoration is not just a private devotion for the individual Catholic. It is liturgical (public worship), because it flows from the Eucharistic Liturgy of Mass, and it leads back to public adoration of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, whom we acknowledge to be THE source and summit of our Christian faith. The God that we adore in Adoration is the same God who died for us and became real food for us. When we adore our Blessed Lord, it intensifies our love of His great sacrifice on the Cross, and our desire to receive Him physically in His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.
