Know the Important Difference!

We thank Tom Venzor, Executive Director of the Nebraska Catholic Conference, for coming to our parish last weekend to tell us about a ballot initiative proposed by pro-abortion activists. He also discussed a pro-life counter-initiative to defeat the pro-abortion proposal, and to help ensure current protections for unborn babies.

Out on the streets, or even at your home's front door, you might be approached to sign one or the other of these initiatives. Please be aware which petition it is by reading the opening words on the petition. **The pro-abortion proposal has the words, "All persons shall have a fundamental right to abortion..."**. Note: Then the wording goes on with such vague and deceptive language that it could even be mistaken as pro-life, but in reality, it would once again allow late-pregnancy abortions into the second and third trimester in Nebraska. Fr. Timmerman and the Bishops of Nebraska strongly urge you to NOT sign this petition or support the pro-abortion effort.

The other ballot initiative, the PRO-LIFE proposal, begins: **"Except when a woman seeks an abortion necessitated by a medical emergency...."**. It then clearly provides protection for unborn children in the second and third trimester. (While this is not perfect protection for the unborn, it will help keep already-existing pro-life laws in Nebraska that protect women, girls, and babies and you can morally support this ballot measure, such as by signing this petition to get specific protection for babies on the ballot.)

So... Fr. Timmerman and the Bishops of Nebraska strongly denounce the dangerous and deceptive pro-abortion initiative, and they support and urge you to sign the pro-life petition. **Look at the beginning phrases in order to be sure you know which initiative is being presented to you** – the person handing you the petition might also use deceptive words! We hope and pray that the pro-life initiative will have enough signatures to get on the November ballot. Both sides have until July 3rd to get enough signatures for their proposal. There will be more information in the bulletin after the deadline in July.

Dear Parishioners,

Please remember that this weekend (May 11&12) and next (May 18&19) is the **2024 Charity and Stewardship Appeal** (formerly known as DDP). This is a solid fundraiser for our parish, while at the same time supporting some important ministries throughout the diocese, like the Family Life Office and Catholic Social Services. Those are two ministries that many of our local parishioners benefit from directly. Since our parish financially supports two Catholic schools (St. John the Baptist & Lourdes Central in Nebraska City), 100% of all donations come back to our parish once we meet our goal. This is really a great way to not only help our fellow diocesan Catholics, but also to help ourselves with our own parish needs.

I also write a check to the Charity and Stewardship Appeal because it is important that I do what I am asking you to do. We have parish volunteers that will be available to help you make your donation and fill out your pledge card either before or after Mass. I would really like to see a high percentage of our families make a gift to this important campaign. Thank you for your generosity to our diocese and our Church of the Holy Spirit parish.

We need an AED for our church. And what is it? According to the Red Cross, an AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

Sudden cardiac arrest is among the leading causes of death in the United States. In fact, more than 350,000 people will suffer a cardiac arrest this year. Currently, the only way to restore a regular heart rhythm during cardiac arrest is to use an AED. Because the average response time for first responders once 911 is called is 8-12 minutes, and for each minute defibrillation is delayed, the odds of survival are reduced by approximately 10%, having access to and AED and knowing how to use one, is critical.

We do have an AED in the school hallway, but since the doors to the school from the church are locked, it would take more time to unlock the doors, retrieve the AED, and come back into the church or Commons. Ideally, we would like to have an AED in the Commons area that could serve both there and the church itself.

Some of you were present at the 10:30 Easter Sunday Mass, and know we had a medical situation during the Eucharistic Prayer. Fortunately, an AED was not needed then, but we would feel more comfortable knowing that an AED was in close proximity if needed. Also, during that episode, I was happy to see that we had many emergency medical responders jump up into action. When we can get one, the AED is easy to use, and once opened, a computerized voice speaks instructions on what to do.

An AED, a wall mount, and an Emergency Preparedness Kit (to assist our security team and other volunteer emergency responders) would cost \$2,500. If you would like to donate towards this for our Commons/Church, please talk to me or Mike Bridges, the head of our parish security team. Or you can indicate so on the memo of your check. Thank you.
