National Eucharistic Procession On June 21st, twenty-one Church of the Holy Spirit parishioners walked for a section of the National Eucharist Procession that had begun in California! They joined more than 500 others for this section of the procession, joining at Cloisters on the Platte retreat center near Gretna, to walk the 5-mile stretch to the

Holy Family Shrine. At the Shrine, two more CHS parishioners joined in for the transferring of Jesus in the Monstrance from Bishop Conley of the Lincoln Diocese to Archbishop Lucas of the Omaha Archdiocese, and for Eucharistic Adoration there. It was an extremely hot and humid day, but still, there was a nice representation of our parish in this historic National Eucharistic Procession!

Dear Parishioners,

CORRECTION: Last week I stated in my article that the net profit for the Spring Dinner and Auction was \$132,213, but I failed to include the funds raised that night for the Special Project of access control for the school, as well as the anonymous matching gift of \$25,000. Therefore, the grand total was **\$204,113!** Thanks again for an incredible night of love and support for our parish and school.

Next week we will have parishioners traveling to Indianapolis to participate in the National Eucharistic Congress. This is the climax event for the Eucharistic Revival that has taken place over these past three years. We pray for their safety and that the Holy Spirit will shower them and all attendees from across the country with many graces of faith and devotion towards our Lord truly present in the Blessed Sacrament.

Regarding the Holy Eucharist, here are a few friendly reminders. The main requirements to receive worthily Holy Communion are pretty well known to us: we need to be free from mortal sin (if we are not, we need to go to Confession before receiving again), that we have the right intention when we receive, and that we keep the eucharistic fast as it applies to us.

We should also make sure that our external appearance is in accord with our internal fitness to receive as well. Our bodies and clothing should be clean when we attend Mass and receive our Blessed Lord. We should always strive to wear our "Sunday best" for Mass on the weekend. At daily Masses, the Lord would certainly welcome the worker in his work clothes who stops in for Mass before work; or even the truly poor person who doesn't have a set of dress clothes. But regardless of our financial status, being clean and neat is reachable for everyone.

It is also reachable for everyone to wear clothes on Sunday that are a level above our daily norm. As we get into the heat of the summer, please remember to avoid beachwear, and to dress your best for our Lord. Just as people dress their very best for a wedding to honor the bride and the groom on their special day, even more so should we dress our best with reverence and devotion for Jesus, the Bridegroom of the Church and the King of Kings! He above anyone else has the right to expect that our dress outwardly expresses the interior reverence, respect and love that we have for Him. And we can all do so much better than shorts and a T-shirt.

Some will say, "But Father, shouldn't you just be happy that people are coming to Mass, regardless of how they are dressed?" Of course, we are pleased that Catholics are coming to Mass, obeying the Commandment of God and the precept of the Church. But we also need to think of others and their ability to pray well when we choose our clothes for Mass. If something chosen is immodest, even if your opinion says it is not, it can still be a cause of distraction or temptation for someone else. Lastly, the clothes that we choose to wear at Mass should be at a higher level than the norm because it actually does help us to approach the Mass better and pray it with greater reverence. Our dress doesn't change God or the Eucharist we receive, but it does change us and our disposition. I would argue that wearing clothes that are a step above "casual", greatly enhances our worship experience at Mass, because we are taking the time to invest in something that we appreciate and take seriously.
