

"All Souls Day Mass Intentions": The Mass is the highest form of prayer and it is good to pray for the deceased at Mass! We will again this year have the All Souls custom where, in the Commons, you list the names of all those who have died who you want to pray for, and, in the marked box put whatever amount you deem appropriate as a stipend. Or put the stipend in an envelope clearly marked for that purpose, and drop it in the collection basket. These will be collected through October. The names are put together as "All Souls Day Intentions" and the stipends collected are divided into the standard \$10 Mass stipends. That many Masses are then offered throughout the year for all those listed. This way, probably on a weekly basis, one of the priests' Mass intention will be for all these departed family members and friends.

The Legion of Mary is going to offer a "Do-It-Yourself Retreat", for women or men, in preparation for making or renewing a Marian consecration. We did this a few years ago and would like to do it again. Some of you may still have the book, and you can use it again this time. It is called "33 Days to Morning Glory" by Fr. Michael Gaitley, and it is based on what was promoted by St. Louis de Montfort. As it says, it takes 33 days to complete the consecration. If you would like to do the retreat as a group, we will start on Nov 5 so that it will end on Dec 8, feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Every week we will read about how one of our four giants of Marian consecration lived out his or her consecration to Jesus through Mary. The goal is to ponder their message in our hearts. If you want to know more about our Blessed Mother through four great saints, this would be a great opportunity. We will be selling the books for \$5.00 NEXT weekend – Oct 12/13. <u>Jubilate Youth Choir</u> is now recruiting members!



<u>What:</u> Youth choir for students ages 2nd grade and up, for StJB students or homeschool/CCD students who are parishioners at CHS. (1st grade by invitation if they display the maturity needed to be successful in choir.)

"Jubilate" (yoo-bee-latte) means "joyful noise" in Latin.

When: The group will debut at the 4pm Mass on Christmas Eve, Dec 24. Then, beginning in January 2025, they will lead music at a designated Mass on the 4th weekend of the month - initially at the 10:30am Mass on Sun, Jan 26. Rehearsals will be once monthly, the Monday prior to the 4th Sunday, 3:30-4:30pm.

<u>Why:</u> To develop a love of sacred music and learn how to lead music reverently and joyfully at Mass. To learn simple 2-part harmony pieces and represent our parish and school in a positive way both at church and in our community.

Where: Practices will be held at StJB school in the music room, with Mass being held in the church.

Dear Parishioners,

The theme for this year's Bishop's Appeal for Vocations (BAV) is "Stewards of the Mysteries of God." This comes from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. As a steward, Catholic priests have a great and humbling responsibility to guard and administer the Sacraments of Christ and His Church. I do say that as priests we have to guard them, because we are taking care of sacred things that ultimately do not belong to us. They belong to Christ.

For example, when a priest offers the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, he is not making it up as he goes along. Nor is he doing one thing this day and a completely different thing tomorrow. The Mass belongs to Jesus, because it is His eternal sacrifice to the Father. Every Catholic priest has been handed down a great gift of the liturgy (which literally means, "public worship"), and it is not his to craft into something of his own desire or taste, but rather a "mystery of God" to be cared for and respected as a living and breathing inheritance of Sacred Catholic Tradition, originating from the Son of God Himself.

We need many more priests, because "the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few" (Matt. 9:37). There is so much work to be done, not only in our diocese, but all over the world. We need more priests to bring the new life of God into our soul at Baptism, absolve us of our deadly sins, anoint us when we are gravely sick or dying, and bring us the "holy bread of eternal life" in Holy Communion. We need more priests to prepare couples for marriage, comfort the grieving, teach our children the faith, and dedicate his life to prayer for his people and the Church.

Our Diocese of Lincoln has traditionally been greatly blessed by God with vocations to the priesthood. When I entered the seminary in the Fall of 1996, I was one of 13 men to begin formation that year. At the time, we were one of the largest groups for Lincoln. In 2024, our small diocese of around 95,000 Catholics has been abundantly blessed with 17 new seminarians, and definitely one of the largest entrance classes in the history of the diocese. God is so good to us!

I am grateful for your support of this appeal when I was in the seminary. Your donations helped the diocese to fund my education, something I simply could not have done on my own. The overall goal for the BAV this year is \$791,700. Our goal as Church of the Holy Spirit parish is \$18,000, and I ask you to be generous for the future of our local church here. We may not think that we are personally in great need of a priest and his ministry at this moment, but there will come a day when we are getting ready to pass from this world to the next. We will want (and hopefully our family members will want it for us too if we are not able to ask – **tell them now if you are not sure!**) a priest for confession, anointing, Apostolic Pardon and Holy Viaticum. Everything that the Church has available to send us on our final journey to our Father God in heaven.

I think of my donation to BAV now as an investment for the future. Perhaps the seminarian today that benefits from our support now will be the priest who is present there to hear our confession, baptize your baby, or minister to you on your deathbed. Your generosity in support of new priests will echo literally in time and eternity! What a blessed opportunity that is for us all! Thank you for your generous support of the Appeal, and please offer a prayer of gratitude to God for the abundant gift of our seminarians, especially the new men that He has blessed us with this year.




