Dear Parishioners, Our parish has been blessed with a recent gift from one family of \$15,000 towards paying down our debt. This brings the total parish debt down to \$137,690. Of that, only \$22,690 remains for the *building* loan portion of our debt!!!, along with \$115,000 for *operational* loans needed in 2013 & 2015.

As I wrote in last week's bulletin, getting this far is fantastic! At the end of last September, the *building* portion of the debt stood at \$54,105. Thanks to dedicated parishioners who have been continually giving to pay down the debt, steady progress has continued to be made. Then with this large one-time extra donation, it became apparent that the end of our *building* debt is quite within reach! Let's keep up the good work! I think it would be wonderful if in four weeks' time we could match or surpass that gift of \$15,000 with more extra gifts from parishioners. Do you think that by day's end on February 9th, with the steady plus the extra effort, we could maybe even <u>finish off</u> the remaining \$22,690 building debt portion??? What a good milestone to have accomplished! If you would like your donation to go towards the debt, just indicate so with your envelope or on your check.

And if we happen to surpass the \$22,690, we'll get going on the *operational* portion of our debt! -Fr. Timmerman

This could have a significant impact on the lives of family members who do not know if they should withdraw treatment from their loved ones at the end of live, health care workers who are unsure about participating in certain jobrelated activities, and couples who are seeking guidance on the Church's teaching on reproductive medicine, etc.
