#### SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

Each Knight participates as his time and talents allow. Some men are present for the majority of our activities, but the larger portion contributes where they can three or four times a year. Some Knights are active-duty military or in demanding jobs that don't allow much participation.

Almost everything we do is **family friendly**. For example, kids have joined their fathers to help with our **monthly breakfasts**, parish **clean-up days**, and **construction projects**—all good father-child opportunities. Our **Monthly Rosary**, open to the parish and held every second Wednesday at 6:30pm in the Church, is likewise a family prayer event.

Knights also take advantage of fraternal benefits, including life insurance, investments, and financial planning.
