Lenten Regulations for the Diocese of Lincoln

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

<u>Fasting</u> means eating one full meal with two smaller meals, which together do not equal the full meal. No snacks or eating between meals allowed. Fasting obliges Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.

Abstinence means eating no meat nor soup nor gravy made from meat. Abstinence obliges all Catholics over the age of 14. Sickness, hard manual labor, pregnancy, etc., automatically excuse a person from these obligations. Nevertheless, it should be pointed out that these are **serious** obligations. In cases of doubt or question, the priest who hears a person's confession should be consulted.

Holy Sepulchre Cemetery guidelines for Spring Cleanup of decorations ◆Prior to the start of spring cleanup, all decorations from winter must be removed from graves by March 10th except those in permanent vases: No shepherd hooks, statues, figurines, eternal light, etc. are allowed from March through November unless they are permanently and correctly installed in the minimal 4" foundation ribbon of the headstone. Grave blankets are not allowed any time of the year. Remove any seasonal / holiday flowers or decorations from fall and winter. Our parishioners who maintain the cemetery grounds will clear out the above stated objects that should not be in the cemetery March-November. Before March 10. please check any cemetery areas where you have placed decorations to make sure they are kept within the guidelines. If in doubt, please remove any objects, or call the rectory for clarification.

What should I do for Lent this year?

<u>Stations of the Cross each week.</u> (See the schedule in the bulletin.) As you pray through the Stations, ask Jesus what it is that He wants you to notice. Ask Mary what she saw and felt during each point of Christ's Passion. Your heart will grow in love for Jesus!

Daily Masses are at 7:00am and 8:10am Monday-Friday, and Saturdays at 8:00am. Lent is a holy time of year to get to extra Masses throughout the week.

Read the Gospels. Two chapters a day will move you through the four Gospels during the Season of Lent. The daily readings are also provided in an app at: www.truthandlifeapp.com, or simply search the app store on your phone or tablet for the free "Truth and Life Bible App".

Almsgiving. Especially on Ash Wednesday, but continued throughout Lent, it is a custom to give extra-heavily of alms (money), as a reparation format that is understood by the world, to God for our own sins and for sins of others. How can we give these alms to God? By giving to your parish to support the good done through His Church.

<u>Crucifix.</u> If you don't have a crucifix in your home, buy a simple one and put it in your bedroom.

Begin dedicating a weekly hour of adoration of Our Lord. Pray like you can't otherwise! Who is it you will be meeting with? Jesus Himself! How wonderful of a Lent that would be to begin the habit. If you'd like a regular hour of adoration, our current open hours are: Sundays at 1am, 2am & 3am; Tuesdays at Midnight; Thursdays at Midnight & 2am; Saturdays at 3am. (Oh, what extra graces must be given in the extra efforts of a middle-of-the-night hour!) Leave a message for Traci at 297-2295, and she'll call you back to set up your hour of the week. Or... each Sunday check out the Adoration table in the Commons to see which hours are open in the upcoming week, and take the hour for that particular date.

Pray for somebody. As you're at work, driving the highways, or in the grocery store, etc., pick out a person who appears to be in need and pray for that person. Truly notice the person, and pray with specific thought! Sometimes the way we can help is indeed to pray, and to trust that in doing so we are contributing to God's grand plan.

<u>Discerning Hearts podcasts.</u> Lent is an appropriate time to get the free great app from Discerning Hearts, or another Catholic app. Then be determined to listen to a podcast once or twice a week.

Doing, Bearing, Self-denial:

<u>Doing:</u> daily family rosary; daily spiritual reading; eating simpler meals and giving the money saved to the poor or the Church; being more cheerful, helpful, and respectful to family members, fellow workers, neighbors, etc.

<u>Bearing with smiling acceptance and resignation:</u> hardships, pains, sufferings, and various kinds of discomforts and inconveniences.

<u>Giving up:</u> television, Facebook, smoking, alcoholic beverages, or junk food and snacks. Also, giving up anger, envy, grudges, greed, etc.
