They offer Free Personal Ethics Consultations, which help patients and their families understand and apply Church teaching to the difficult medical situations they face. Their ethicists are available 24/7 by phone and email, and this service is free of charge.

This could have a significant impact on the lives of family members who do not know if they should withdraw treatment from their loved ones at the end of live, health care workers who are unsure about participating in certain job-related activities, and couples who are seeking guidance on the Church's teaching on reproductive medicine, etc.

### **Special Holy Week Collections:**

Holy Thursday – Collection for Catholic Social Services
Please note that the collection at this Mass will go to CSS in Lincoln, to assist them in our diocesan work for the poor.

Good Friday – Collection for the Holy Land Every year on Good Friday, a collection is taken up in Catholic Churches to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land, where they are now less than 2% of the population. Your support is essential to help the Church minister in parishes, provide Catholic schools, and offer religious education. This collection also helps to preserve the sacred shrines of Christianity, including in Jerusalem, Nazareth, and Bethlehem, to name only a few. The war in Israel has hit Christians in the Holy Land particularly hard. In these times of crisis, this collection is necessary to meet the basic needs of the People of God still living in this Land and to maintain a Christian presence where the Church was born. When you contribute, you join with Catholics around the world in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land. Please be generous!

### Dear Parishioners,

It may seem like it was only yesterday that we prayed about what we were going to do for our Lenten penances. But now there are only two weeks left! Next Sunday will be Palm Sunday already, and then we enter into the most remarkable week of the whole year, Holy Week. I pray that your Lent is going well. But even if it is not exactly what you wanted it to be, don't be discouraged. There are still two full weeks left to make a real change in your life with our Lord. Start over again, and make the most of this valuable season.

Our tradition here at CHS is to have a Palm Sunday Penance Service at 3:30 p.m. We will have many deanery priests here, so please take advantage of the opportunity. Making a good and holy confession is not only a beautiful thing to do, it is also one of the 6 (six) precepts of the Church. The precepts of the Church are binding on all Catholics, and they exist in order to strengthen and encourage us to keep the 10 Commandments, practice the teachings of Christ from the Gospel, and to increase the virtues of faith, hope and charity in our souls. Here is a quick review of the Precepts of the Catholic Church:

- 1. Assist at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
- 2. Fast and abstain on the days appointed.
- 3. Confess at least once a year.
- 4. Receive the Holy Eucharist at least once a year, at Easter time.
- 5. Contribute to the support of the Church.
- 6. Observe the marriage laws of the Church.

These are just the bare minimums for all Catholics. Jesus wants you to live not the lowest possible life in the Church where you are just hanging on, but a truly abundant life with Him that is full of joyful blessings for you and added glory for God! So, if going to confession on Palm Sunday is an annual tradition for you, that is great! We are very glad that you are here. But if it is the only time a year you come, or twice including Advent before Christmas, I encourage you to try going monthly to confession. You might say that you don't think you sin very much in a month, but I will honestly tell you, it is a lot easier to confess monthly, or bi-weekly, or weekly, because your life and your sins are much easier to remember. Many of us forget what we ate for lunch yesterday, so it is probably not surprising that we have a hard time remembering all of our sins in the past 6 months!

So regular confession, be it monthly, bi-weekly or weekly, not only makes it a lot easier for us when confessing our sins, it also allows us to receive many more graces to destroy old habits of sin and strengthen the virtues. God wants to fill us with an overflow of His love and help in our lives, and He desires happiness for us now and for eternity. He doesn't want us living just the bare minimums, He wants us to live the abundant life with Him.
