<u>Cemetery decoration placement, Memorial Day weekend:</u> Decoration of graves for Memorial Day (May 26) can be placed on the Friday before and must be removed no later than 7 days after Memorial Day.

Please also keep in mind that, with the exception of during the above stated Memorial Day time-frame, shepherd hooks, statues, figurines, eternal light, artificial flowers etc., are not allowed from *March through November*, unless they are permanently and correctly installed in the minimal 4" foundation ribbon of the monument/headstone. No items are allowed in or on the ground. All live flowers, wreaths, etc., must be removed from graves as soon as they are withered or dried.

Dear Parishioners,

I am pleased to announce that our parish steering committee has selected **Carlson West Povondra Architects** (CWPA) from Omaha to lead us in the Master Planning process for all of our facilities. They were selected out of a total of four firms who replied to our Request-for-Proposal with submitted bids.

As you will recall, last year we underwent a Facilities Needs and Condition Assessment (FCNA) that identified the current condition of our church and school buildings. Master Planning is the second step of our process to enhance our facilities identified most recently in our Strategic Plan, which can be found on our parish website.

Before a Master Plan is brought to life, CWPA will ask questions and listen. They will be visiting with the priests, school principal and parish staff, but also the school teachers and a variety of parishioners. They will want to know more about the spiritual life of our parish, what our liturgical needs are, how our church and school operates, and our dreams for the future. They will be looking specifically at our worship spaces, educational facilities, gathering and fellowship areas, outdoor playground areas, and parking. They will also address future growth and ministry space needs.

Once they receive input from you, they will develop many different planning concepts. These different concepts will explore different strategies for how our facilities are organized, how they are connected, possible expansion, as well as aesthetics – all the while enhancing the visible Catholic identity of our whole campus.

Lastly, CWPA will refine the preferred plan to include a landscaping vision and architectural character. They will prepare conceptual designs for us to view, including renderings, massing studies and preliminary budgets to help guide decision making, any future fundraising, design and construction efforts.

This is an exciting time for our parish! Please plan to attend future meetings and presentations to provide your feedback and let your voice be heard. The most successful Master Plan is developed when the parish is active and engaged in the conversation. More information on future meetings will be announced soon.
